That's why our NSS unit successfully organized the selection process for the President and Vice-President. In addition, we selected each Department Coordinator as well as the Heads of various Portfolios.

# > Introduction:

Leadership plays a vital role in shaping the direction and effectiveness of any organization, especially when it comes to student-driven initiatives like the National Service Scheme (NSS). With the beginning of a new academic year, it was essential to appoint a new leadership team that would take forward the spirit of social responsibility, unity, and active participation among students.

Another video displayed a compilation of the NSS activities conducted throughout the academic year, including:


- Blood Donation Camps

#### > Introduction:

The NSS Unit of RSCOE organized a Health Checkup Camp on 27th September 2025 at Jayawant Library, in collaboration with ONP Hospital. The camp aimed to promote health awareness, encourage preventive care, and ensure the well-being of both teaching and non-teaching staff members.

This initiative was an important step in addressing lifestyle-related health issues such as diabetes, hypertension, and obesity, which are commonly observed among working professionals. By bringing healthcare facilities to the workplace, the camp made preventive healthcare accessible, convenient, and impactful.

#### > Activities:

1. **Inauguration (10:00 AM):** The camp was inaugurated by the Respected Director , Deputy Director, HOD's of all departments and NSS Program Officer, who highlighted the importance of preventive health checkups in maintaining overall well-being. ## > Transportation & Logistics: -


